MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Welcome Spring and bring on Summer!

Once again, our lake community residents have survived yet another winter of mixed weather. The lake was blanketed in almost 2 feet of snow before Thanksgiving giving many the hope of a hardy winter sports season. But the up swing in temperatures brought a mild month of December.

The snowmobile season never began until Christmas week and was short lived until the first couple of weeks of March. The lack of thick ice on the lake limited some of the seasonal activities as well.

The weather for our 2022 season on the lake was like many have said.....” a good old fashion summer”. We had sunshine and warm temperatures and people took advantage of it all. The activity on the water was evidence of that for sure. The camps were active and people were out and about on the water in numbers.

We held our Annual Meeting on June 18, 2022 at the Town Hall. Immediately following the meeting we held our first Chicken BBQ outside. Unfortunately, we did not have a good result in the amount of sales. The weather did not help at all, with a cold and gray day. However, we did donate many dinners to the Forestport Softball Tournament that was underway that weekend. Lessons were learned and we will continue to search for new activities to be held throughout the year.

The Boater Safety Course was again held in the Town Hall in person in June 2022. The class was full once again. As always, many thanks to Sheriff Rob Maciol for providing that service and thanks to Deputy Rob Snyder for his instruction.

A successful boat parade was held in 2021 and scheduled for July 30, 2022. A call for volunteers to form the committee to organize the parade was made at the annual meeting. Unfortunately, we had no volunteers interested in putting this together so there was no event. We will bring this up again at this year's meeting and canvass for involvement.

In August 2022, the X-Squad Ski Team performed their annual Ski Show on the lake. There was a Learn-to-Ski Clinic held the week before the show that was attended by 15 local aspiring skiers. The local skiers showed off their skills in their own show prior to the main show by the X-Squad Ski Team. The spectators on Dustin Road, on the shore and in every boat on the water enjoyed the show along with all of the skiers.

The Poker Paddle was held the Saturday following Labor Day and again, exceeded the number of paddlers from the prior year. It was the most attended since we began the event.

As in the past, the Poker Paddle is a fund raiser for our local First Responders. In the past years, following the event, a donation was made to the Forestport and Remsen Volunteer Fire Departments of \$250 to each and the STAR Ambulance Co. We donated \$250.00 to each of these fine first responder agencies again in 2022. We thank them for the service and dedication to our community.

The 2023 Season:

The Board of Directors held its annual meeting on April 23, 2023 to review the annual Treasurer's report on funds and membership, and created a schedule of events for 2022.

The Annual Meeting of the Association will be held on June 10, 2023 in the Forestport Town Hall on NY Rt 28, Forestport. There will be coffee and donuts starting at 9:00 am with the business meeting starting at 9:30 am.

The Boater Safety Course is scheduled for June 24th in the Town Hall. You can register on line or call into the Sheriff's Office. Read on for more details.

The Board has set the date for the Boat Parade as July 29th. It was lots of fun in 2021 and we hope to repeat the number of boats in the parade. It made for great viewing.

A cardboard boat race will be held at the Island on August 5th. Read on for the details of this fun new event.

The Kayuta Lake Ski Show performed by the X Squad Exhibition team is scheduled for August 19th opposite the Island. It can be viewed from the Dustin Rd. Bridge or the

shoreline along the Ferncliff Rd. However, the best front row seats are found on a boat in the water. There will be a learn-to-ski clinic the week leading up to the show. Read on for the details and contact information.

The Poker Paddle will be held on September 9th. It has grown year after year and everyone enjoys a late summer day on the lake. If you don't wish to paddle around for hours, it is a unique sight to behold. There are kayaks everywhere. If you are out on the water in a motor boat, please pay extra attention to the much smaller and lower profile kayaks. Please keep your speed down and reduce the size of the wake that you are displacing whenever you are in close proximity of the kayaks. As always, proceeds will be donated to our local first responder agencies.

In the past several years a group of community minded people have organized a Christmas Light Parade on River St. Forestport. It will be held on December 10, 2023 and all are welcome to participate either by entering a float or just walking. But everything and everyone must have lights! It's a fun event to participate in on a float or as a spectator. This year the KLIA will enter a float. All are welcome to get involved and come up with ideas for a theme, or volunteer to create/decorate the float and or join us on the float or walking with the float. Remember, we will all be lit up!

There is interest in holding a winter event on the lake. We have identified President's weekend 2024 as the target date. There are a few ideas being discussed and we welcome ideas and further discussion at the annual meeting. The weather and ice thickness will be major factors in any decision.

Responsible Boating:

This is an annual message to all who operate boats on the river and the lake. Know the rules of the water and follow them. **Maintain 5 mph, no wake, when traveling under the bridges and within 100 ft of shore. YES.....that means even between the red and green channel markers at the tip of the island and up the river!!!!**

Jet skis are governed by the same rules and laws. Keep to the right under the bridges and follow the 5 mph speed limit. Speeding under the bridges is not just against the law, it's dangerous. Courtesy and common sense go a long way on the lake.

Kayakers, canoeists and others using smaller non-motorized watercraft should use caution when paddling in the middle of busy traffic areas during active boating times. Stay closer to the shoreline and always wear brightly colored clothing or vests. And exercise extreme caution when out on the water in low light conditions, especially dusk or after dark.

Please be safe and courteous!!!!

TREASURER'S REPORT

The beginning balance as of January 2022 was \$9,301.73. Our year end audited balance for 2022 was \$8,675.16. The audit of the Adirondack Bank account, PayPal transactions, deposits, expenses, and the account register was conducted in January 2023 to verify these balances.

Total expenses for 2022 were \$10,725.82 with the largest expenditures being for the Poker Paddle (\$4655.65), the chicken barbecue (\$2307.13), our newsletter (\$573.90), the support of the Mohawk Valley Waterski Club (\$1500), and our donations to the Forestport Fire Dept, Remsen Fire Dept, and STAR Ambulance Company (\$250 each).

Total revenue of \$10,099.25 came primarily from the Poker Paddle (\$4,815), and memberships (\$1,155 less PayPal fees). We had 79 paid members in 2022 primarily made up of our family memberships rather than business members. We received additional donations with our membership fees in the amount of \$720: \$280 for fish stocking, \$190 for waterski show, and \$250 for general use.

Please note that the KLIA board has voted to raise family membership to \$20 for the 2023 season due to the increased costs that we are all experiencing. Those who have already submitted their 2023 memberships of \$15 will be honored as paid in full.

1. 2023 Boat Parade:

Saturday August 19th (rain date in August 20th) at 2pm with the Ski School show beginning at 1:00pm. This is the a widely attended event sponsored by KLIA so if you've never seen the show, you will not be disappointed. The show will take place at the same spot as usual on the north side of Dustin Bridge in front of the Corrigan home. The show space will be buoyed off and spectators are expected to anchor on the outside of the buoys for the safety of the skiers. The X-Squad is looking forward to yet another fantastic year showing off their skills on Kayuta Lake and entertaining residents and visitors.

4. Cardboard Regatta (Sink or swim)

We are super excited to announce this new one-of-a-kind spectacle of epic cardboard creations! Boaters of all ages will design and build a human-powered boat made from only cardboard and duct tape! The design is completely up to you! Let your imagination take over: make your boat look like a racecar, a space ship, or even a dragon! Costumes are welcome too! Then, bring your boats to the island for the 1st Annual Cardboard Regatta on Saturday August 5, 2023. ALL AGES ARE WELCOME!

Check in will start at 10:00am and racing will begin at 11:00am. Racers will paddle their boats to the buoys and back. The distance of the buoy will be based on age category. Younger children will go a shorter distance, and adults will go a further distance. Quickest boaters to cross the finish line win! Awards for first, second and third in each age group – all children under the age of 14 will get a participation ribbon!

RULES:

- *Singles only - no teams
- *Boats can ONLY be propelled by oars or canoe/kayak paddles or your hands
- *Boats must have sides. No surfboard style boats allowed
- *The ENTIRE boat must be built from cardboard and duct tape
- *Wood, metal, Styrofoam, paint, rubber inflation devices or other materials that would provide buoyancy, and/or other materials that would aid floatation or make the hull rigid are prohibited! This applies to the keel, transom, ribs, hull, etc.
- *Racing will begin in the water with racer in the boat – One or two people may steady the boat – no pushing is allowed
- *Every racer MUST wear an approved Personal Floation Device (PFD).
- *Sunken or discarded boats must be taken back with the racer or other responsible party – PLEASE DO NOT LEAVE YOUR CARDBOARD ON THE ISLAND!
- *Most importantly, HAVE FUN!

We are really excited for this new event and hope to see everyone cheer on the courageous boaters as they race through the waters of Kayuta Lake! You can also vote for your favorite boat! We saw some amazing designs for the boat parade in 2021; let's see if we can go bigger with the Cardboard Regatta! If you have any questions, you can email Karin at KLYNG@aol.com.

NYS DEC – Required Permits

As an annual reminder, DEC permits are required for any work that causes a disturbance to the bed or the bank of our waterways. A permit is also required for any excavation or fill that is below the mean high water level,

such as rip rap or dredging. (Article 15). Permits are also required for any work within a wetland or within 100'. (Article 24). Permits may also be required by other agencies, such as NYS Canals or the US Army Corps of Engineers. Even if you don't think you require a permit from DEC or other agencies – check check check.

Written determinations can be provided by sending a written request along with the location (tax parcel number), written description of project and photos of the project area. If DEC concurs that no permit is required, they will respond in writing and you will have a permanent record if the project is ever questioned down the road. Oneida and Herkimer County projects are generally handled in the Utica Office.

FISH UPDATE

Hello Everyone,

We have had a very mild spring this year, ice cleared off the lake early. Boats were running the lake in April. The lake was stocked last October with tiger muskies. They are stocked at 6 inches in size. Please remember these fish cannot reproduce so please consider taking measurements length, girth (length around belly), and a picture and you can release the fish and have a replica mount made for your wall. This can be done for any fish. Tiger muskies help maintain a healthy ecosystem in our lake and help minimize our pickerel numbers. Small mouth bass populations continue to do well, largemouth bass have been successfully breeding for many years now. Please do not target bass before the season open as this is when they are reproducing. As new batches of bass are locally spawned each year our lake's bass population genetics improve, adapting to our lake's unique conditions. They are growing and getting larger every year. Remember if you want to keep catching photo worthy fish, please release the large fish you catch to let them to continue to grow and spawn. Please keep the 1 to 2lb fish if you want to have a meal. Don't forget about trying to fish for panfish which are doing extremely well in Kayuta. Sunfish, bullhead, and perch are great starter fish for kids. Fast catching times really helps keep the early fisher people's attention.

There continues to be some Northern pike caught out of Kayuta. I have caught a few of these fish but there are not a lot of them, though they are in the lake. If you catch a fish that looks like a pickerel but has stripes in its tail and is spotted body pattern it is a pike - please let these go. Bass and pike have thriving populations throughout the Adirondacks. Pike focus on cannibalism when they reach larger size which means they feed mostly on our pickerel in our lake. I want you to

know the Kayuta Lake Association has not stocked these fish and to remind everyone not to self-stock any species of fish. Stocking without proper permits is illegal and it risks introducing diseases and various invasive species into the lake like zebra mussels.

Delta Lake and Hinckley Lake are both listed as having zebra mussels now. Please be careful to clean out live wells and boats if you are lake hopping between any other lakes. Letting your boat completely dry before changing lakes is the best way to prevent these organisms from spreading. If you cannot let it dry, please wash your boat and if you have a live well pour boiling water or Clorox water through it. Remember to remove all seaweed from your trailers before leaving any lake. If you use braided fishing line please make sure it has completely dried before using on any other lake. Otherwise, you can also spread invasive species from lake to lake, mono fishing line does not have this problem.

Hoping we all can have a great summer enjoying the lake. Please be extra careful of fishermen and kayakers on busy lake days; their boats are usually going a slow pace. Please practice catch and release with any large fish!!!! I am always happy to look at pictures of fish you have caught.

BOATER SAFETY COURSE

The Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation provides the public with a safe and enjoyable environment for recreational boating. Their goal is to assist the boater in developing safe boating habits and maintaining a strong law enforcement presence on our waters. Everyone can be a safer boater by following three simple suggestions:

- Take a boating safety course
- Wear your life jacket
- Don't drink alcohol while boating

Under a new law, known as Brianna's Law, all motor boat operators:

- Born on or after Jan. 1, 1993 will need a boating safety certificate beginning in 2020.
- Born on or after Jan. 1, 1988 will need a boating safety certificate beginning in 2022.
- Born on or after Jan. 1, 1983 will need a boating safety certificate beginning in 2023.
- Born on or after Jan. 1, 1978 will need a boating safety certificate beginning in 2024.
- All motor boat operators regardless of age will need a boating safety certificate beginning in 2025.

Approved courses include those offered by NYS Parks, the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary or the U.S. Power Squadrons. Individuals less than 10 years of age may not take this course of instruction. Certain allowances to this law have been made for visitors to New York, persons renting a boat and persons purchasing a new boat for the first time. Courses may be completed and certificates obtained through the Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation, U.S. Power Squadron, or the U.S.

Coast Guard Auxiliary. A list of approved courses is available on the State Parks website <http://nysparks.com/recreation/boating/education.aspx>. The state has also approved additional online courses this year that are offered through boaterexam.com, boat-ed.com, boat-us.org and americasboatingcourse.com. Regardless of age, all personal watercraft (PWC) operators still need a Boating Safety Certificate.

State Parks encourages everyone, regardless of age, to consider taking a boater education class to sharpen their nautical knowledge. Please be mindful of the rules and regulations and considerate of property owners by abiding by no-wake areas. As always, remain vigilant and take extra care while passing through confined and congested areas.

For New Yorkers who have earned a Boating Safety Certificate, keeping track of it is even easier thanks to New York's new Adventure License. New Yorkers who have taken an approved safe boating course and received a Boating Safety Certificate, with just a few easy steps, can have the certification reflected as an anchor icon on their NYS Driver License, Non-Driver ID or Learner Permit. The personalized Adventure License eliminates the need to carry a separate certificate. For more information on the other benefits of getting an Adventure License, visit licensecenter.ny.gov.

The KLIA sponsored Boater Safety Course will be held on June 24th at the Forestport Town Hall. This is an eight hour class that was presented by the Oneida County Sheriff's Office. ISLAND ETIQUETTE

The KLIA is asking anyone that utilizes the lake, as well as the island and sandbars, to enjoy it as much as you can but would also like to remind everyone of the following:

- Carry-in / Carry out, no garbage or debris should be left on the island or sandbars. Do not use your lake as a garbage can.
- Please be courteous to others- this is state property and all are welcome.
- The islands are utilized by all ages, please be aware of the language you use including any profanity.
- If your favorite beverage comes in a glass container, please make sure it leaves in one piece with you. We all are bare foot in the sand and no one wants to step broken glass. Please leave the island and lake the way you found it, but better – if you see trash, pick it up. We all love the lake—lets show everyone just how much!

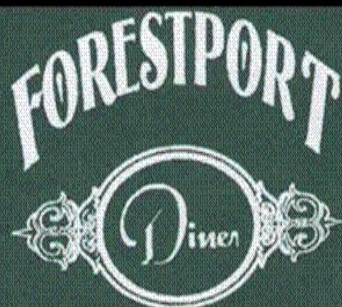

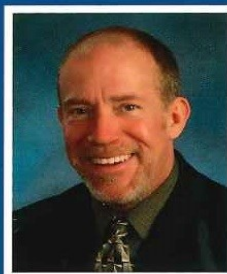
