KAYUTA CRITTERS



Are the geese making a mess on your lawns? Are you wondering what you can do so they will leave your water front alone? Here are a few "green" suggestions:

- Geese feed off young grass shoots. If possible leave your tailored lawns a little long (about 10-14") at least near the water's edge. Avoid using fertilizer that encourages new tender grass or replace your grass with plants like ivy, pachysandra, juniper, periwinkle, myrtle, hostas, plantain lilies or fescue (grass).
- If you have a dog, tie him near the shoreline.
- Don't feed any of the lake birds including ducks.
- Plant or encourage native shrubs or wild flowers on the shoreline and create a natural fence. Geese do not like obstacles.
- Install fencing at least 14" high. Barriers will be more effective during the summer molt when flying is difficult for

the geese (mid June- July).

- Plastic and nylon fencing may be effective but will require more maintenance.
- Some people have resorted to a low voltage electrical fence as well. This should be at least 8 -16" above the ground.
- If fencing is not an option, you may have luck with Mylar tape. This tape should be strung on stakes that are 20 feet apart. Make sure you twist the tape at least once before securing it to the stakes. When the wind blows the tape produces a sound that will repel the birds.

Boater Safety Course

Though there is no KLIA sponsored Boater Safety Course this year, The Oneida County Sheriff's office is busy teaching classes all over the county. There are also many classes scheduled around the rest of NY state. Those interested in taking a course in your area can check the schedule posted on the NYS Parks and Recreation website at www.nysparks.state.ny.us/recreation/boating/safety-courses.aspx. Contact information to register for these classes is also listed on the website.

Whether you have a boater safety certificate or not, all KLIA members are once again encouraged to review the NYS boating regulations with all members of their family and visitors that will be boating on Kayuta Lake. Several scary incidents last summer resulted in some injuries on the lake so please be mindful of the "rules of the road". Knowing the requirements is each boater's responsibility.

Please continue to be respectful of the speed limits especially in the areas of Dustin Rd. and Ebert's bridges as well as the railroad trestle. Congestion and blind corners in these areas can create dangerous situations that unsafe speeds can greatly compound. Enjoy the summer and stay safe!

DAM AND WATER LEVEL

Jong Longway from Algonquin Power Company reported that there was a FERC inspection of the Kayuta Lake dam on Monday June 6th. There was an underwater dam inspection on Friday the 10th. Both inspections concur that the dam is in need of repairs. This is tentatively scheduled for this summer/fall season. As far as he knows there have not been any decisions about lowering the lake to complete the repairs and the lake level is still currently 1141.60. John has a monthly inspection to complete hopefully mid week and then after that he will raise the lake level to 1141.70. This is the same as they did for Kayuta last year. John explained that every month an inspection is to be performed, the lake will be dropped to .60 to allow access to the dam and for a better inspection. The raising and lowering process takes a couple days to complete.

SEPTIC SYSTEMS

Here's the poop! Local codes enforcement officers can issue the required permits for updating your septic system. All new and/or replacement systems must be designed by a licensed engineer and seepage pits/dry wells can no longer be installed as new systems. They are legal until they fail and must then be replaced with the appropriate engineer designed system, as location and soil conditions dictate.

For those who wish to test their septic systems to be sure they are not leaching any waste into the lake, test kits are available at the Spring and Fall meetings or contact any of the board members. Kits are \$4.00 each.

BUOYS ON THE LAKE

I have been contacted by the New York State Navigation division about their plans for replacing and possibly adding additional Buoy markers on Kayuta Lake.

At an undisclosed time in the near future they will again contact me to set a time to travel the lake together to point out these replace and possible new buoy locations through the main channels of the Lake.

FISH STOCKING UPDATE

As per our discussions at the 2010 Fall meeting, we held off on stocking bass until we could get a survey of how well the current population is doing. We were concerned that the state

stocking of tiger muskie at the rate of 1000/year would kill off newly stocked bass. At our request, the state did not stock tiger muskie in the fall of 2010.

We are currently working to retain Dan Josephson to arrange with the DEC an electro-shock fish survey to get an accurate picture of the fish population in the lake. Dan works for Cornell and his rate is \$80.00/hour for consulting, drafting an information letter to NYS and speaking with the DEC to convince them to do a sampling on Kayuta Lake. He expects this to take four hours of his time. Hopefully, the outcome will lead to NYS conducting the fish survey. We have reached out to NYS ourselves but to no avail due to state funding issues.

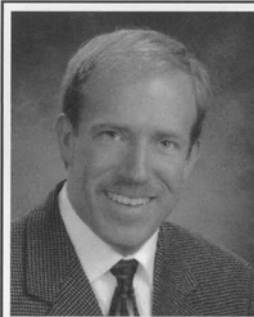
