Well the grass has finally turned green and there are buds on trees everywhere, even some leaves are visible on the trees. The pollen in the air is plentiful and the black flies have arrived! We finally have cracked the 80 degree mark on May 19th! The past few days have finally turned the corner and as we approach an early Memorial Day weekend we can only hope that summer weather will be here to stay soon. The local camps are beginning to show some signs of activity, the campgrounds are filling up, and the local stores and restaurants are all starting to experience the increased traffic that comes with the return of the many people who enjoy the summer weather on and around the lake. Put your docks and boats into the water and get to work. It's time to clean, repair, and prepare for the upcoming months of fun, both on and off the water. Welcome back! It's nice to see everyone again.

Those of us who spend all four seasons on the lake enjoyed another beautiful fall foliage season. We saw some early snowfalls that gave us a white Thanksgiving. Snowmobiling and skiing began early further to the north, but this season's snowfall was in a wide range of inches. Many of our local trails could not completely open with the normal connections to other clubs until after Christmas. That made for a slower start for around the lake while points north bustled with activity. The month of January and February provided for the usual activities for the winter sports enthusiast. And, if you're timing was right, the amount of snow made for good snowmobile trails throughout Forestport, connections to Tug Hill, and Town of Webb. Once again, a big shout out to the Trackside Blazers, the Lost Trails, and the Penn Mountain clubs for the work of the many volunteers who all make the trail system as great as it is.

We had another successful summer in 2018 holding our

traditional and popular events. With the cooperation of the Oneida County Sheriff Rob Maciol, the Navigation Patrol provided the instruction and materials for the Boater Safety Course that the KLIA sponsors every year. Read on further in this newsletter for dates and information on the 2019 course. The Sheriff's Navigation Patrol also spent time and effort in providing random marine patrols on the lake, with special attention during the busy holiday weekends and during the KLIA sponsored lake events. They have reinforced their commitment to provide, yet again, a level of patrol that maintains safety and order for all who are using the lake.

The Annual Meeting was held on June 9th at the Forestport Town Hall and was attended by over 70 people. There was a pleasant social hour spent over coffee and donuts prior to the start of the meeting and as always a very productive meeting with a full agenda of events and discussion. This year's meeting will be on Saturday, June 8th and all are encouraged to attend.

The Island Fun Day continues to enjoy popularity. The committee members that do the set-up, shopping, cooking, along with the DJ, have been long time volunteers and a couple of newer Board members as the games coordinators, another great day was achieved. This is a repeat message that needs to be stated: If you are coming to the island for the entire day, you are encouraged to "car pool" with other boaters if you can. This allows for more people to come and enjoy the food and games. There just isn't as much land mass as there was back in the day.

2018 was the 14th year that the Camp Mohawk Valley Ski School held a Water Ski camp on Kayuta Lake. The camp ran for two weeks in early August. The ski camp trains skiers of all ages and helps them improve their skills. Whether the skill was knee boarding, wake boarding, two skis or one, or even going over the ski jump, the camp handled it all. Thank you to Joe and Chrissy Serth for their work with the youth of our community and the quality of their instruction. The two week camp was culminated with an exhibition show that highlighted the local talent. The local youth were joined

in the second half of the show by the X-Squad Competition Ski Team. This was the 15th year of the X-Squad Ski Show on Kayuta Lake. This highly talented group of young people once again entertained all of the spectators. This event is without argument the most widely attended event of the KLIA sponsored events. The boats filled with people "tailgating" combines with a packed island and stadium like seating on the shoreline. As in the past, the camp and the ski show all take place at the docks and shoreline of the Corrigan family. Another huge thank you to the Corrigans for their continued support of this great activity. The Ski school and show will be returning this summer. Read on for the details.

We did not hold a Land Picnic in 2018. The Board of Directors had voted to not schedule the Picnic due to the steady decline in attendance over the past several years. The cost versus benefit had been carefully weighed by the board that led to this decision. There was an open discussion at the Annual Meeting. There were those who voiced their disappointment and hope that this event returns. Many had no preference as they admitted that they did not partake. The Board also sought volunteers to step forward and take responsibility for this event. This was becoming more of a challenge as the majority of the Board members serve on the committees for the various annual events. Throughout the summer there were other individuals, not present at the Annual meeting that expressed their desire to have the picnic continue and also volunteered to be involved. The Board has voted at their Annual Board meeting to establish a budget and support the committee that is yet to be formed. We now have a chair and a committee. They have set a date and location for this year's picnic. Read on for those details.

2018 was the second year of the Kayuta Lake Poker Paddle. This event, in which just over 100 kayakers participated again, was a tremendous success. The registration fees paid for the participant's T shirts, prizes and refreshments as well as the donations to both the Forestport and Remsen Volunteer Fire Departments. The committee is working out some of the finer points of determining the final winners and I'm confident they will have a smooth process for this year. A box lunch at the Island for all participants was a new addition in 2018 and that will be part of this event going forward. Read below for the details of this event which is sure to will only grow and be bigger and better this year.

Boat Launch - State Dam Road:

We have all witnessed the deterioration of the ramp surface over the past several years. I have learned that the boat launch is the responsibility of the company that contracts with Canals to operate the dam and Hydro plant. In early 2018, I contacted the Dam operator and sought repair of the launch ramp and the Dam operator pledged

to repair the launch ramp. I was assured that it was already in their plans to address the repair of the ramp. They had applied for the required permits from the NYS-DEC and was issued that permit in late fall. Unfortunately, it was too late in the construction season to begin the project. When the weather this year finally became suitable for construction to begin, it fell within the prohibited months to enter the water. The DEC permit will not allow construction into the lake bed from March 15 to July 15 due to fish spawning. The operator has pledged to commence construction as soon as the permit allows. As we are informed, we will post updates and any closing notifications on our Facebook page.

Responsible Boating:

This is a very important message that deserves repeating: With the best summer months ahead of us, let's take the time to talk about responsible boating. It is all of our responsibility to ensure that we obey all rules of the water. We need to teach our children and our grandchildren these rules. We should expect, if not demand that our guests on this lake also comply with these rules. Not because they are the laws of New York State alone, but because this is our lake! This is our river! Disregard for the laws is disregard for our treasure that we have here at Kayuta. We have children on tubes and water skis. We have an abundance of kayakers and canoeists. Jet skis that jump the wake of boats and speed under the trestle and Dustin Rd. Bridge put everyone at risk for serious injury. Speeding boats under bridges will do even more damage than the PWCs. Damage is done to shorelines and boats at their docks when speeding within 100 feet of shore occurs. We have many creeks and coves that boaters enjoy. The 5 mph or No Wake rule must be followed.

We see new generations of families using the long held family camp. We see new owners at those properties that have been newly purchased. We hear the same comments and complaints at every annual meeting. Let's each of us work this year to talk to others. Take the time to explain why these rules are so important and to seek cooperation and an ownership spirit among those who live and recreate around and on our lake.

The island on the third lake is used by more and more people each year. Many of those people launch at the State Dam and enjoy the lake for the day. We can only encourage and appeal for all who use the lake to "take out what you bring in". We continue to experience broken glass in the sand. A variety of used paper products tossed and left in the bushes and trees. PLEASE.....pick up after yourself, and even pick up one more of something and take it out with you. Let's have an enjoyable, safe, and clean summer.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Hello Kayuta Lakers! The audit committee completed its annual audit on May 25, 2019. Deposits and checks were verified against bank statements since last audit; website online PayPal transfers reviewed and verified; and current PayPal balance is zero with all funds transferred to the primary Adirondack Bank account. No discrepancies or deficiencies were identified.

Our KLIA audited balance is \$12,746.99. Membership for 2018 was 128 memberships, an increase from 2017. We anticipate some of the member-sponsorships to turn into paid memberships in 2019 and hoping for a second year of increased membership. Total Income for 2018 was \$7,182.64 and expenses \$9,162.60 with a loss of \$1,979.96, which is attributed to unsold merchandise purchased in 2018, 2017-2019 website fees, and the purchase of 3 years of KLIA stickers at a discounted price. The Poker Paddle raised \$1,911.57 after expenses. The Island Funday cost \$311.14 but noted to increase paid memberships. The Mohawk Valley Water Ski Show and sponsorship was \$1,300 total and the event had a good turnout of memberships.

NYS DEC – Required Permits

As an annual reminder, DEC permits are required for any work that causes a disturbance to the bed or the bank of our waterways. A permit is also required for any excavation or fill that is below the mean high water level, such as rip rap or dredging. (Article 15). Permits are also required for any work within a wetland or within 100'. (Article 24). Permits may also be required by other agencies, such as NYS Canals or the US Army Corps of Engineers. Even if you don't think you require a permit from DEC or other agencies – check check check.

Written determinations can be provided by sending a written request along with the location (tax parcel number), written description of project and photos of the project area. If DEC concurs that no permit is required, they will respond in writing and you will have a permanent record if the project is ever questioned down the road. Oneida and Herkimer County projects are generally handled in the Utica Office.

FISH UPDATE

Fish stocking is always a big topic during the Spring meeting so please feel free to bring forth any questions, concerns or ideas on June 8th.

The KLIA board continues to research the opportunities available to us either through the NYS DEC or commercially. Though there are no current plans, fact-finding and the distribution of information to the membership will be a continuous process that will be used to develop any future strategy.

BOATER SAFETY COURSE

The Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation provides the public with a safe and enjoyable environment for recreational boating. Their goal is to assist the boater in developing safe boating habits and maintaining a strong law enforcement presence on our waters. Everyone can be a safer boater by following three simple suggestions:

- Take a boating safety course
- Wear your life jacket
- Don't drink alcohol while boating

All individuals born on or after 5/1/96 are now required to successfully complete an approved course in boater education in order to operate a motorboat. Approved courses include those offered by NYS Parks, the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary or the U.S. Power Squadrons. Individuals less than 10 years of age may not take this course of instruction. Certain allowances to this law have been made for visitors to New York, persons renting a boat and persons purchasing a new boat for the first time. Courses may be completed and certificates obtained through the Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation, U.S. Power Squadron, or the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary. A list of approved courses is available on the State Parks website http://nysparks.com/ recreation/boating/education.aspx. The state has also approved additional online courses this year that are offered through boaterexam.com, boat-ed.com, boatus.org and americasboatingcourse.com. Regardless of age, all personal watercraft (PWC) operators still need a Boating Safety Certificate.

State Parks encourages everyone, regardless of age, to consider taking a boater education class to sharpen their nautical knowledge. Please be mindful of the rules and regulations and considerate of property owners by abiding by no-wake areas. As always, remain vigilant and take extra care while passing through confined and congested areas.

For New Yorkers who have earned a Boating Safety Certificate, keeping track of it is even easier thanks to New York's new Adventure License. New Yorkers who have taken an approved safe boating course and received a Boating Safety Certificate, with just a few easy steps, can have the certification reflected as an anchor icon on their NYS Driver License, Non-Driver ID or Learner Permit. The personalized Adventure License eliminates the need to carry a separate certificate. For more information on the other benefits of getting an Adventure License, visit licensecenter.ny.gov.

The KLIA will again sponsor a Boater Safety Course which will be held on June 29thd, 2019 at the Forestport Town Hall. This is an eight hour class that will be presented by the Oneida County Sheriff's Office. When registering with the Sheriff's Office be sure to tell them that you are a KLIA member as there are reserved slots for the course designated for KLIA members.

Upon successful completion of the course attendees will receive NYS certificates of completion that is required for any over the age of 10 to operate any motor boat, and those of any age to operate any PWC.

There is no cost to attend and you must be at least 10 years old. The class starts at 9:00. Preregistration is desired but not mandatory. You may call Robert Snider at 315-765-2222 or go to www.nysparks.state.ny.us/recreation/boating/safety-courses.aspx to register for this class and for information on other courses being offered.

The KLIA will provide coffee, juice and donuts. You should bring your own lunch as the class will take most of the day.

ISLAND ETIQUETTE

The KLIA is asking anyone that utilizes the lake, as well as the island and sandbars, to enjoy it as much as you can but would also like to remind everyone of the following:

- Carry-in / Carry out, no garbage or debris should be left on the island or sandbars. Do not use your lake as a garbage can.
- Please be courteous to others- this is state property and all are welcome.
- The islands are utilized by all ages, please be aware of the language you use including any profanity.
- If your favorite beverage comes in a glass container, please make sure it leaves in one piece with you. We all are bare foot in the sand and no one wants to step on broken glass.

Please leave the island and lake the way you found it, but better – if you see trash, pick it up. We all love the lake—lets show everyone just how much!

KAYUTA LAKE CRITTERS

The Osprey was seriously endangered by effects of pesticides in mid-20th century; since DDT and related pesticides were banned in 1972, they have made a good comeback in many parts of North America. Osprey can be found along rivers, lakes, coast – basically any body of water, either fresh or salt, where large numbers of fish are present. May be most common around major coastal estuaries and salt marshes, but also regular around large lakes, reservoirs, rivers. Migrating Ospreys are sometimes seen far from water, even over the desert.

A very distinctive fish-hawk, formerly classified with other hawks but now placed in a separate family of its own. Along coastlines, lakes, and rivers almost worldwide, the Osprey is often seen flying over the water, hovering, and then plunging feet-first to catch fish in its talons. After a successful strike, the bird rises heavily from the water and flies away, carrying the fish head-forward with its feet. Bald Eagles sometimes chase Ospreys and force them to drop their catch. In many regions, landowners put up poles near the water to attract nesting Ospreys.

Nest site is usually on top of large tree (often with dead or broken top) not far from water. Also nests on utility poles, duck blinds, other structures, including poles put up for them. Ospreys may nest on ground on small islands, or on cliffs or giant cactus in western Mexico. Site typically very open to sky. Nest (built by both sexes) is bulky pile of sticks, lined with smaller materials. Birds may use same nest for years, adding material each year, so that nest becomes huge.

The female osprey remains with young most of time at


first, sheltering them from sun and rain; male brings fish, female feeds them to young. Age of young at first flight averages about 51-54 days. 1 brood (2-4chicks) per year.



Osprey typically feed on fish 4-12" long. Type of fish involved varies with region; concentrates on species common in each locale. Aside from fish, rarely eats small mammals, birds, or reptiles, perhaps mainly when fish are scarce.


