## **MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT**

Welcome Spring! Welcome back to all the seasonal campers and visitors. Bring on Summer!

Our lake community residents have survived yet another winter of mixed weather. Fall lasted longer into the season and winter teased us on its arrival. The cold was not shy at all. January saw multiple mornings of -20 degrees or more, yet the snow was late in coming. The traditional winter sports did not get into full swing until mid to late January. The snowmobile season was another short season. It started late and ended early. Our local clubs did a great job on what little natural snow that we had. Once again, a huge thank you to the Trackside Blazers, the Lost Trails and Penn Mountain clubs for doing their best to give us a great trail system around our lake communities.

Our 2021 season on the lake saw us attempt to return to the summers that we all had known before the pandemic summer of 2020. Our restaurants and bars were once again serving their food, beverages and ice cream to full dining rooms and happy patrons. The camps were active with people and people were out and about on the water in numbers.

We held our Annual Meeting in the Town Hall in-person, after holding a virtual meeting in 2020. The attendance was very good, considering that many were only just starting to venture into indoor public gatherings.

Our Boater Safety Course also returned to an in-person class, and that filled to maximum capacity. Once again, many thanks to Sheriff Rob Maciol for providing that service and thanks to Deputy Rob Snyder for his instruction.

A suggestion to hold a boat parade was brought up in discussion during our annual meeting. There had been an annual parade for many years but interest eventually declined and there hasn't been one in at least ten years. With Natalie Roth as the chair, a committee was formed and a parade was held in July. Seventeen boats

participated with spectators on the shoreline on all the lakes. The boats were decorated with great detail and imagination. It was without a doubt a success.

In August 2021, once again we were entertained with a Ski Show. There was a Learn-to-Ski Clinic held the week before the show, followed by a display of skills learned by our local kids and concluded by a ski exhibition show by the X-Squad Ski Team.

The theme of last year's Poker Paddle was the 20th anniversary of 9/11. It was the largest attendance since it started. Over 100 paddler's spent the day on the lake going from stop to stop to register their presence. The pandemic forced a change from handing out poker chips to a non contact technique. Kudos, to the co-chair and Board Member Aaron LaBella for creating a computer software app that is downloaded to a phone that allows the paddler to connect to the phone at the stop. The app assigns a poker card and at the conclusion of the day, each paddler's poker hand is processed by the software and the highest hand wins. The winner received a kayak and second place a paddle board. There are seven stops along the three lakes. The stops are staffed by volunteers and each compete with the other stops to be voted the Best Stop by the paddlers. It is without a doubt the largest event with the greatest participation by volunteers, participants and spectators.

As in the past, the Poker Paddle is a fund raiser for our local First Responders. In the past four years, following the event, a donation was made to the Forestport and Remsen Volunteer Fire Departments of \$250 to each. In 2021, we included the STAR Ambulance Co. We donated \$250.00 to each of these fine first responder agencies and we thank them for the service and dedication to our community.

### **The 2022 Season:**

The Board of Directors held its annual meeting on April 2, 2022 and created a schedule of events for 2022.

The Annual Meeting of the Association will be held on June 18, 2022 in the Forestport Town Hall on NY Rt 28,

Forestport. There will be coffee and donuts starting at 9:00 am with the business meeting starting at 9:30 am.

There was much discussion last year about holding a chicken BBQ. There was a melding of a chicken dinner on the day of the boat parade. It was decided by the Board to hold the BBQ on a land based location and on the same day as the Spring Meeting. Therefore, there will be a Chicken BBQ on the same day, starting at 11:00 am until sold out. The BBQ will be held in the parking lot alongside of the Town Hall.

Come to the meeting at 9:30 and take home a chicken dinner. You do not need to attend the meeting to purchase the chicken. The BBQ is open to the public and all are welcome to drive in and buy some chicken.

The Boater Safety Course is scheduled for June 25th in the Town Hall. You can register on line or call into the Sheriff's Office. Read on for more details.

The Board has set the date for the Boat Parade as July 30th. We need a chairperson and a couple people to work on the committee. It was lots of fun last year and we hope to repeat the number of boats in the parade. It made for great viewing.

The Kayuta Lake Ski Show performed by the X Squad Exhibition team is scheduled for August 20th opposite the Island. It can be viewed from the Dustin Rd. Bridge or the shoreline along the Ferncliff. However, the best front row seats are found on a boat in the water. They are planning on a learn-to-ski clinic the week leading up to the show. Read on for the details and contact information.

The Poker Paddle will be held on September 10th. It has grown year after year and everyone enjoys a late summer day on the lake. If you don't wish to paddle around for hours, it is a unique sight to behold. There are kayaks everywhere. If you are out on the water in a motor boat, please pay extra attention to the much smaller and lower profile kayaks. Please keep your speed down and reduce the size of the wake that you are displacing whenever you are in close proximity of the kayaks. As always, proceeds will be donated to our local first responder agencies.

### **Responsible Boating:**

This is an annual message to all who operate boats on the river and the lake. Know the rules of the water and follow them. Maintain 5 mph, no wake, when traveling under the bridges and within 100 ft of shore. YES.....that means even between the red and green channel markers at the tip of the island and up the river!!!!

Jet skis are governed by the same rules and laws. Keep to the right under the bridges and follow the 5 mph speed

limit. Speeding under the bridges is not just against the law, it's dangerous. Courtesy and common sense go a long way on the lake.

Kayakers, canoeists and others using smaller non-motorized watercraft should use caution when paddling in the middle of busy traffic areas during active boating times. Stay closer to the shoreline and always wear brightly colored clothing or vests. And exercise extreme caution when out on the water in low light conditions, especially dusk or after dark.

### **Corporate Members:**

The 2020 Covid year was followed by the 2021 Covid year. As we enter the third year of Covid, we find that most of our society is living with a new normal of Covid in our lives and health. The economic impact of these past two years is still with us and our business community. Many of our Corporate Members or business sponsors are in the food & beverage and service sectors. They have been hit hard with the consequences of these years. Many people have not returned to the jobs that were hardest hit during the lockdowns. Hours of operation have changed and staff is not always 100%. Be courteous and above all be patient...

And we also leave a free supply at a couple of local diners and restaurants in the hope of spreading the news of the lake activities to those who are not members.

We maintain a website that posts all of our events as well as this newsletter. The website is now capable of accepting membership payments, donations and registration for the Poker Paddle. We also maintain a Facebook page that also posts all of our events and provides a means of communication between people

within the lake community.

We need members and people to get involved. Not only to take part in the lake activities but to maintain the mission statement of the KLIA. ## **TREASURER'S REPORT**

2021 saw a change in Treasurer from Dave Wallace to Carrie Kifner. I would like to thank Dave for his diligence in keeping our account in order over the past couple years.

The audited balance as of January 2021 was \$ 12,673.54 and as of the transition on 8/2/21 was \$11,517.88. Our year end balance for 2021 was \$9,301.73 and there is a current balance \$9,345.88 which reflects additional members. The audit committee is scheduled to review the Adirondack bank account, PayPal transactions, deposits, expenses and the bank account register by end of June 2022.

Total expenses for 2021 were \$11,183.43 with the highest expenditures due to the Poker Paddle (\$5,169.67), our newsletter (\$1,000.04), the support of the Mohawk Valley Water Ski Club (\$1,500.00), and the addition of buoys and signs on the lake for improved safety (\$1,479.19).

Total Revenue of \$7,811.62 came primarily through the Poker Paddle (\$5,565.00) and Memberships (\$1,320 less PayPal fees). We had 88 members in 2021 primarily made up of personal memberships rather than business members. We received additional donations with our memberships in the amount of \$420: \$260 for fish stocking, \$85 for the ski show, and \$75 undeclared.

The Poker Paddle continues to be one of our most popular events with it generating a net revenue of \$395.33 and a very fun filled day!!

## **NYS DEC – Required Permits**

As an annual reminder, DEC permits are required for any work that causes a disturbance to the bed or the bank of our waterways. A permit is also required for any excavation or fill that is below the mean high water level, such as rip rap or dredging. (Article 15). Permits are also required for any work within a wetland or within 100'. (Article 24). Permits may also be required by other agencies, such as NYS Canals or the US Army Corps of Engineers. Even if you don't think you require a permit from DEC or other agencies – check check check.

Written determinations can be provided by sending a written request along with the location (tax parcel number), written description of project and photos of the project area. If DEC concurs that no permit is required, they will respond in writing and you will have a permanent record if the project is ever questioned down the road. Oneida and Herkimer County projects are generally handled in the Utica Office.

## **FISH UPDATE**

Tiger muskies are thriving in the lake right now. I have caught several tiger muskies so far this year, all released unharmed. Due to a computer error the lake was not stocked last year. I talked with the DEC and they have fixed the problem and we are back on the list for fall this year. Remember this stocking is provided free by the state. The muskies are about 6 inches when they are stocked. We will continue to accept these wonderful fish yearly unless the Association votes in a majority to discontinue. If you are lucky enough to catch one of these beautiful fish, please consider taking a picture and measuring the length of the fish and its girth at its fattest point. You then can have a replica mount made to hang on your wall and let the tiger go to catch another day at a larger size. These replicas actually look better than the real fish mounts and can be cleaned off with a garden hose when they get dusty. (You can get replicas of any species of fish) Tiger muskies are sterile and unable to reproduce. These fish help healthy ecosystem in our lake and help minimize our pickerel numbers.

Largemouth bass have been successfully breeding for many years now. Please do not target bass before the season open as this is when they are reproducing. Some of the largemouth are now larger than 7lbs. Please release any large bass so they can breed.

Smallmouth bass are also doing well - several 16-19 inch fish are swimming around our lake. There have been some Northern pike caught out of Kayuta. I have caught a few of these fish, and now several other people have caught them and shown me pictures. If you catch a fish that looks like a pickerel but has stripes in its tail, it is a pike - please let these go. I have talked with Dave Erway from the DEC about how these may have gotten into our lake. Although he has a few ideas, nothing is definite. For those wondering if these will harm the bass population remember that most Adirondack lakes with thriving bass populations also have pike with them.

I want you to know the Kayuta Lake Association has not stocked these fish and to remind everyone not to self-stock any species of fish. The fish or water you bring with them may be loaded with disease and other aquatic hitchhikers. Delta Lake and Hinckley Lake are both listed as having zebra mussels now. Please be careful to clean out live wells and boats if you are lake hopping between any other lakes.

Letting your boat completely dry before changing lakes is the best way to prevent these organisms from spreading. If you cannot let it dry, please wash your boat and if you have a live well pour boiling water through it. Hoping we all can have a great summer enjoying the lake .

Please practice catch and release with any large fish!!!! Have a great summer!!!

## **BOATER SAFETY COURSE**

The Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation provides the public with a safe and enjoyable environment for recreational boating. Their goal is to assist the boater in developing safe boating habits and maintaining a strong law enforcement presence on our waters. Everyone can be a safer boater by following three simple suggestions:

- Take a boating safety course
- Wear your life jacket
- Don't drink alcohol while boating

Under a new law, known as Brianna's Law, all motor boat operators:

- Born on or after Jan. 1, 1993 will need a boating safety certificate beginning in 2020.
- Born on or after Jan. 1, 1988 will need a boating safety certificate beginning in 2022.
- Born on or after Jan. 1, 1983 will need a boating safety certificate beginning in 2023.
- Born on or after Jan. 1, 1978 will need a boating safety certificate beginning in 2024.
- All motor boat operators regardless of age will need a boating safety certificate beginning in 2025.

Approved courses include those offered by NYS Parks, the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary or the U.S. Power Squadrons. Individuals less than 10 years of age may not take this course of instruction. Certain allowances to this law have been made for visitors to New York, persons renting a boat and persons purchasing a new boat for the first time. Courses may be completed and certificates obtained through the Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation, U.S. Power Squadron, or the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary. A list of approved courses is available on the State Parks website <http://nysparks.com/recreation/boating/education.aspx>. The state has also

approved additional online courses this year that are offered through boaterexam.com, boat-ed.com, boatus.org and americasboatingcourse.com. Regardless of age, all personal watercraft (PWC) operators still need a Boating Safety Certificate.

State Parks encourages everyone, regardless of age, to consider taking a boater education class to sharpen their nautical knowledge. Please be mindful of the rules and regulations and considerate of property owners by abiding by no-wake areas. As always, remain vigilant and take extra care while passing through confined and congested areas.

For New Yorkers who have earned a Boating Safety Certificate, keeping track of it is even easier thanks to New York's new Adventure License. New Yorkers who have taken an approved safe boating course and received a Boating Safety Certificate, with just a few easy steps, can have the certification reflected as an anchor icon on their NYS Driver License, Non-Driver ID or Learner Permit. The personalized Adventure License eliminates the need to carry a separate certificate. The KLIA sponsored Boater Safety Course will be held on June 25th at the Forestport Town Hall. This is an eight hour class that was presented by the Oneida County Sheriff's Office. - Carry-in / Carry out, no garbage or debris should be left on the island or sandbars. Do not use your lake as a garbage can.
- Please be courteous to others- this is state property and all are welcome.
- The islands are utilized by all ages, please be aware of the language you use including any profanity.
- If your favorite beverage comes in a glass container, please make sure it leaves in one piece with you. We all are bare foot in the sand and no one wants to step broken glass. Please leave the island and lake the way you found it, but better – if you see trash, pick it up. We all love the lake—lets show everyone just how much!

## **KAYUTA LAKE CRITTERS**

Hundreds of kinds of hummingbirds nest in the American tropics, and more than a dozen in the western U.S., but east of the Great Plains there is only the Ruby-throated Hummingbird. There it is fairly common in summer in open woods and gardens. Hovering in front of a flower to sip nectar, it beats its wings more than 50 times per second. Impressive migrants despite their small size, some Ruby-throats may travel from Canada to Costa Rica.



### **Feeding Behavior**

At flowers, usually feeds while hovering, extending its bill and long tongue deep into the center of the flower. At feeders, may either hover or perch. To catch small insects, may fly out and take them in midair, or hover to pluck them from foliage. Sometimes takes spiders (or trapped insects) from spider webs.

### **Eggs**

The ruby-throat usually lays 2-3 eggs which are white in color. Incubation is by female only and lasts 11-16 days. Only the female feeds the young. Nest stretches as young grow. Age of young at first flight about 20-22 days. Usually 1-2 broods per year, sometimes three. Female

may begin building second nest while still feeding young in the first.

### **Diet**

Mostly nectar and insects. Takes nectar from flowers, and will feed on tiny insects as well. Favors tubular flowers such as those of trumpet vine. Will also feed on sugar-water mixtures in hummingbird feeders.

### **Nesting**

In courtship display, male flies back and forth in front of female in wide U-shaped "pendulum" arc, making a whirring sound on each dive. Also buzzes back and forth in short passes in front of perched female. Nest site is in a tree or large shrub, 5-50 feet above the ground, usually 10-20 feet. Placed on horizontal branch or one that slopes down from tree, usually well surrounded by leafy cover. Nest (built by female) is a compact cup of grasses, plant fibers, spider webs, lined with plant down. The outside is camouflaged with lichens and dead leaves.

### **Migration**

Almost all leave North America in fall, wintering from Mexico to Costa Rica or Panama. Some may cross Gulf of Mexico but many go around, concentrating along Texas coast. In spring, males move north earlier than females.


